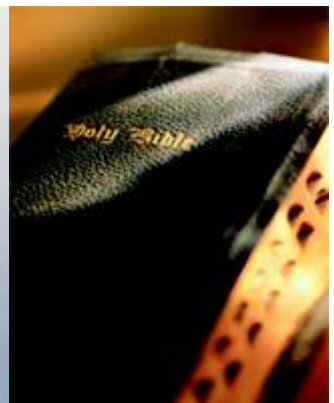

In the morning, before Metro-rail, Shosholoza and other Transnet areas start becoming alive with masses of people hurrying in different directions on their way to work, someone is already praying for them.

Mnutuzeli Collins Bomali was called by God to serve Him in Industrial Ministry, specifically in the Transnet Section. This is his story:

“When I started serving God in this ministry, I had to deal with different kinds of people. Some didn't even want me to enter their offices, but now they invite me

to come and pray for them.

“One morning a woman shared with me her life story and how miserable she was, but I could comfort and support her by telling her about God and that He cares for her and that she must trust Him with her life – He is her solution.

“I could also help a guy whose parents misused the money he gave them, and who are using alcohol. I told him about God and that he could bring these problems to God. When this guy came to thank me after a while because his family is a happy one now, I could tell him not to thank me, but to praise God.

“In Blackheath I serve a youth group on Friday mornings at half past seven

every week. In December 2008 I brought a DVD about the life of Jesus for them to watch. The management also came in to join us. The factory workers were touched so deeply by the story of Jesus that they asked me to supply them with Bibles. Luckily Industrial Ministry could provide me with free Bibles!

“When Metrorail loses an employee through death, they invite me to attend the memorial services and to support the family through prayer.

“It is wonderful to witness how our ministry changes the lives of other people. May God bless us and may this ministry always rise and shine!”

Die mededinging en tegnologiese ontwikkeling het mettertyd meegebring dat die getal werknemers afgeneem het en dat die aantal besoekpunte verminder het.

Ons kom steeds by hierdie werknemers van ons ou vennoot in die werkplek uit, maar dit is baie duidelik 'n nuwe omgewing. Deur die Here se genade en trou is daar egter steeds 'n groepie werknemers wat op die verskillende punte die byeenkomste bywoon en mekaar bemoedig om geloofsgetrou te werk.

Die veranderinge by die KWV is 'n sigbare voorbeeld van hoe die veranderende ekonomie en markte die plaaslike werksplekke raak. Die veranderinge het veroorsaak dat die groepe kleiner geword het. Die ding wat egter nie verander het nie, is mense se behoefte aan die evangelie en aan ondersteuning van medegelowiges in die werkplek.

Daarom kan ons steeds voortgaan en bid dat die Here die deure vir ons sal oop hou. Laat ons getrou bly in hierdie roeping en diens.

## You are important to Biblia

At the Fishermen Ministry's kiosk (Biblia) in Hout Bay, they try to create an environment where people's views are taken seriously and paid attention to. On Wednesday mornings Rev. Gerhard Pietersen of Hout Bay and a group of non-believers enjoy a nice cup of coffee at a large table, discussing relevant religious issues which are debated in the social media like Facebook.

He hopes that people will believe in the care and love of God again, and recover from their personal pain within their faith communities. He shares with us the testimonies of three people in this special group:

"Sarel was a born reformer who was

diagnosed with polio at the age of five. Consequently, he lost the use of his legs and had to get along in a wheelchair.

"After suffering a lot of pain in his marriage, he started examining his faith in God. After a serious assault by a family member in his second marriage, he finally lost his faith in God.

"He still remains an avid student of the Bible and regularly watches the latest DSTV programs on archaeological discoveries. Fundamentalism and prejudice among Christians, however, caused him to shun the church. Unfortunately Sarel is also regularly confronted by Christians which is usually like oil on fire. This gives me the

opportunity to testify, knowing that it is God who works miracles in his own time, teaching me to see others through God's eyes.

"Peter is a young man in his early twenties. We met at Thursday's Biblia group for men. One night he tragically lost a close friend in Mitchell's Plain during a senseless shooting, of which he himself still has a bullet in his right lung. Peter is blessed with a beautiful singing voice and we have invited him to take part in Hout Bay's worship group. His family doesn't live here, but now he has found a home in our community. Peter was recently, during a washing of the feet Sunday, baptized as a member of our congregation.

"Lucky is an Ovambo-fisherman in his thirties, who recently came to Biblia. He speaks fluent Afrikaans. After great sadness in his personal relationships and racial barriers at work, he came to seek assistance for counselling at Biblia. Since then he is struggling to go back to the fishing trade. We are still waiting for his Ovambo Bible."
