

'n KAPEL in 'n FABRIEK?

In 1980 het die oorspronklike eienaar van die meubelfabriek Meyer en Ferreira in Stikland, mnr Tienie Meyer, 'n klein kapelletjie langs die fabriek laat oprig sodat hul werkers 'n ruimte kon hê waar die destydse Nywerheidsbediening, nou Arbeidsbediening, hulle geestelik kon bedien.

Hierdie reëling word steeds deur sy seun, mnr Anton Meyer en sy kleinseuns, Marius en Anthonie toegepas – ds Jannie Booysen van die VGK Delft kom besoek al die afgelope paar jaar die werkers van Meyer en Ferreira elke Donderdagmiddag na middagete.

Die werkers word na middagete op 'n luidspreker aan die diens herinner wat in die kapel gaan begin. Dit word op vrywillige basis bygewoon en duur tussen

tien en vyftien minute.

Die werkers vind die Arbeidsbedieningsessies baie sinvol en getuig: "Dit bou ons gees op; die dienste help ons om ons challenges van die lewe te kan face. Dit versterk ons."

"He helps us to have faith in our hearts; the community needs these good things," sê 'n volgende een.

"Hier voel ek tuis en welkom; ek skep moed en voel versterk," getuig 'n derde.

Ds Jannie Booysen vertel dat hy ook al

so geheg geraak het aan die mense en hulle sal mis as hulle die dag nie opdaag nie.

Werkers is ook welkom om gebruik te maak van die kapel vir gebedsessies in tye van swaarkry en trauma; die sleutel is altyd beskikbaar. Ons loof die Here vir werkgewers met so 'n ongeë-gesindheid.

Biblia cares for Kalk Bay Harbour

If you're driving through the beautiful Kalk Bay again, remember to pop in at the white-and-blue-painted Biblia Harbour Mission kiosk just after the boom on the left. This is where Marvin Petersen and his German wife, Veronika, will welcome you with open arms.

This couple ministers to the Fishing Community of Kalk Bay in general, but

focuses, especially from Tuesdays to Thursdays and Sundays, on the fishermen in the harbour. They provide a cosy and hospitable space where the fishermen are cared for spiritually and where they are provided with Bibles and other spiritual information.

They also serve the youth of the fishing community; on Fridays Veronika leads

Bible study with a group of children (10-17 years) and on Saturdays they are sometimes taken out on interesting trips.

Marvin is currently studying part-time at the Baptist Seminary in Athlone towards being a pastor and is already working on his fourth year of the five-year course.

Veronika obtained a degree in Social Work in Germany already, as well as her Licentiate in Theology from the Bible Institute diagonally across the harbour.

But let them speak for themselves. Marvin explains:

"Most of the workers in the harbour can't attend church in the mornings due to their busy schedules. Therefore, we have decided to bring the church to them. We have devotions at the Biblia Kiosk and experience it as a blessing to the harbour workers.

"The Bible studies with the children living in Kalk Bay continue to be a success and blessing. My wife and I still conduct these studies in the afternoon at the Bible Institute.

"Recently we received an encouraging acknowledgement from one of the parents. She highlighted that we are doing a good job because her child's behaviour and school grades are improving. She furthermore said that we should continue doing the good work.

"It is always a blessing to hear such words of encouragement because it also helps us to keep our focus on what God has called us to do," he says.
