'n Unieke ekumeniese bediening in Vredenburg

“As ek donkermôre opstaan om my kinders reg te kry om betyds by die skool te kom, skarrel om my huis in orde te kry voordat ek ’n bus na die fabriek waar ek werk, betyds te kan haal en uiteindelik, na ’n dolle gejaag by my werk opdaag, is dit asof daar ’n groot hand van liefdevolle genade en liefde op my skouers kom rus as ek hoor ons word weer vanoggend met die Woord bedien.”

So sal Vredenburg se bykans 500 werkgewers en -nemers wat gereeld deur Arbeidsbediening se geestelike werker, Landa Bester, en vrywillige hulpwerkers in die werkplek bedien word, getuig.

Wat Vredenburg uniek maak, is dat 16 van die 17 vrywillige hulpwerkers predikante of pastore is – wat ’n unieke ekumeniese bediening! Die meeste van hulle is ook deel van die ekumeniese groep (wat ander bedieninge in die Weskus ook insluit) wat elke Dinsdagoggend saambid.

Landa vertel: “Deur die jare het ons mekaar se harte leer ken en mekaar leer vertrou – die fondament van goeie verhoudings. Die klem het intussen verskuif van ‘Kerkvisie’ na ‘Koninkryksvisie’. Die hulpwerkers beskou die hulp wat hulle aan Arbeidsbediening bied as ’n geleentheid en

nie ’n ‘werk’ nie. Die ekumeniese groep reël ook lofprysingsgeleenthede, gesamentlike dienste en biddae waar lidmate van verskillende denominasies saamkom.”

Die CBEF (Christo Bester Ekumeniese Fonds) het uit hierdie ekumeniese groep ontstaan wat nie-winsgewende organisasies en projekte wat fokus op die opbou en sosiale ondersteuning van die Weskusgemeenskap bystaan.

Een van hul besoekpunte is die plaas, De Eiken, waar Wilhelm de Kock en sy seun, Hugo, boer. Hulle het so 'n passie vir die Here dat hulle 'n lokaal op die plaas laat oprig het waar hulle en hul werknemers elke Maandag-, Woensdag- en Vrydagoggend om 07:00 byeenkom vir godsdiens.

En wat is dan nou lekkerder as om daardie tyd van die oggend jou eie koffie of tee met die aankoms te gaan maak? Daar staan dan 'n kan kookwater gereed en elkeen van die bykans 200 werkers staan in 'n japtrap met hul warm drinkdingetjie in die hand. En dan wag daar nog later 'n heerlike toebroodjie met die eerste teepouse ook!

Tydens hierdie dienste word daar lekker gesing en musiek gemaak met tromme, 'n klavierbord en 'n kitaar, wat Wilhelm vir hul aangekoop het. Die plaaswerkers het 'n vroue- en manskoor wat vir niks terugstaan nie. En Sondae val die naburige plase ook by hierdie groep in en dán hou hulle behoorlik kerk!

Wilhelm getuig dat daar eers heelwat drankmisbruik op die plaas was, maar sedert hulle hierdie dienste hou, het baie arbeiders hul lewens verander.

Wat 'n wonderlike seën is hierdie plaasbediening vir beide die permanente en seisoenwerkers!

Not paid for a year: Fishermen seek help

Dane du Plessis is very serious about his calling as a missionary amongst seafarers in Cape Town Harbour. He is also passionate about standing up for those who are discriminated against and in this regard he is often supported by Cassiem Augustus, an International Transport Federation (ITF) inspector.

“It is a privilege that, despite the fact that we come from different religious backgrounds, we are able to work as partners towards accomplishing our mutual goal: To fight for the rights of seamen who are ill-treated and underpaid.”

Dane explains, “A week ago, Indonesians approached Cassiem and myself, telling us that they have not been paid for the past year. Recruiting agents usually promise Indonesian farmers a ‘working opportunity’ in which they can travel and earn dollars. What they don’t tell them, is that they will not get their first six months’ salary, seeing as it will go straight into the pockets of their agents. These specific Indonesian fishermen, however, have not been paid for a WHOLE YEAR!

“It is only when they reach a port that is willing to help them that they receive what agents owe them in terms of outstanding salaries. If ITF had not been situated in Cape Town Harbour, with a focus on helping these fishermen, these Indonesians would most probably have served their two year contract without seeing a cent at all.

“After contacting the agents, the owners and agents have agreed to pay the money that they owe, but we are waiting on guarantee letters from the agents before the vessel sets sail. The process we undertake in helping fisherman is an ongoing one and one which we will continue to support. I am therefore extremely grateful that Cassiem (who has a heart for seafarers), as partner of Biblia Harbour Mission, is able to help these fishermen. I consider it a blessing that I can be used by God to help those in need.”

Kalk Bay’s only female fisher now drug free

“This is so amazing! All glory to God! Just being there, caring for the needs of others, makes such a big difference in the lives of those who have been abandoned by others.”

Marvin Petersen of Biblia Harbour Mission Kalk Bay explains, “Martinetta, the only female fisher in Kalk Bay, had been struggling with drugs for more than twenty years by the time she approached us for help roughly two years ago. What followed was a difficult time during which we constantly ministered to her and even got in contact with her mother in Pretoria (who was very glad to hear that there was someone reaching out and trying to help her daughter).

“We had an intense time with Martinetta in the beginning of this year as well. She was always very tearful and emotional, wanting to stop using the drugs that was tearing her life apart, but struggling to do so. We could see that Martinetta was serious about changing her life for the better, so we encouraged her to become part of a drug rehabilitation programme and she followed our advice.

“Unfortunately she stopped attending the rehab after only a couple of days and we didn’t see her again for quite a while.



“Recently, however, she popped in out of the blue, looking healthy and excited! She thanked us for all the time we spent listening to her and encouraging her. She has been drug-free for six months and is still going strong!

“Please pray for this courageous woman and the journey she is on. Please also pray for us as we strive to support and encourage so many people in need.”

After that she got a job at Metrorail and she was able to start a new life. The tragic part is that she is still struggling to get her children back. Collins was able to advise her to get the help of a lawyer and he prayed for her.

(PAK) Namaqua is drie jaar oud!

Die Olifantsrivier-vallei en Namakwaland vier in Junie vanjaar hul derde jaar van 'n nuwe uitgebreide gebied vir Arbeidsbediening. Dit was nadat Jaco en Sandra Leeuwner in Junie 2014 op die plaas, Biesiesfontein, aangekom en begin werk het onder verskillende gemeenskappe waarvan sommige deur die Rietpoort Kliniek bereik is.

Arbeidsbediening word al vir etlike jare in sekere areas van die streek verteenwoordig. In die laat 80's vroeë 90's het Johann Jordaan maandeliks vir

oom Johnny van der Merwe teen die Weskus op vergesel met sake-ontbyte. Later het Arbeidsbediening voortgegaan in die Springbok-area onder leiding van ds Steyn McCarthy (NGK Namakwaland) en past. Johann Fourie (AGS Lofdal) by wie Jaco in 2014 aangesluit het.

Oockie en Lenie Coetzer het in Junie 2015 op Biesiesfontein begin nadat Jaco 'n tweede plaashuis vir die bediening bekom het om hulle in te huisves – hul uitsluitlike doel was om aan te gaan met Biesiesfontein sodat Jaco en Sandra op

die groter streek se ontwikkeling kon fokus.

Na ds McCarthy en past. Fourie se aftrede, het Jaco 'n nuwe Plaaslike Arbeidsbediening Komitee (PAK) saamgestel wat bekend staan as PAK Namaqua. By PAK Namaqua betrek hulle eppare as spanne by die komitee wat dit in hul geval veel meer doeltreffend maak:

- **Willie en Carin Conradie:** Jaco en Willie het saam in Namibië gematrikuleer in 1983. Groot was hul vreugde toe hulle mekaar na bykans 33 jaar weer raakloop tydens 'n Gideonsbyeenkoms naby Vredendal. Willie is verbonde aan die Matzikama Munisipaliteit as Direkteur Korporatiewe Dienste en Carin is maatskaplike werker by die Olifantsrivier Vereniging vir Persone met Gestremdhede. Beide van hulle besef die waarde van Arbeidsbediening en pas dit toe in hul onderskeie werksplekke.
- **Johann en Winnie Jordaan** het hulle in Klawer gevestig waar hulle as geestelike leiers van *Go in Faith Ministries* 'n Bybelskool en uitgebreide bediening na die gemeenskap tot stand gebring het.

Baie dankie aan elke persoon, gemeente en onderneming wat betrokke is by hierdie suksesverhaal.

Oudtshoorn is one of the places in the *Klein Karoo* where Industrial Ministry functions very effectively. This is thanks to efforts of the spiritual worker, André van Staden, and volunteers like Patrick Telemachus who minister to 73 businesses on a regular basis.

Some of the places Carin Brink (Regional Manager of Industrial Ministry in the Cape region) recently visited, included Mr Price, Centry Properties and the squatter community of De Hoop where 16 people currently live in shacks next to the railroad.

She tells the following of this experience, “With my visit to De Hoop the squatters told me that they always look forward to André’s monthly visits because it fills them with fortitude.”

The biggest challenges for Oudtshoorn include the strongly established culture of begging, poverty (which leads to drug addiction and the abuse of alcohol) and unemployment (which is the primary cause of all these problems).

It is, however, very encouraging that the churches in Oudtshoorn have such a positive attitude towards Industrial Ministry. The *Oudtshoorn-Noord* Congregation of the Dutch Reformed Church, as well as the Presbyterian Church, have granted Industrial Ministry the opportunity to lead a service during the course of the year by means of a core message and song.

Mosselbaai-omgewing se Plaasbediening

“Hoe kan hulle Hom dan aanroep in wie hulle nie geglo het nie? En hoe kan hulle in Hom glo van wie hulle nie gehoor het nie? En hoe kan hulle hoor sonder een wat preek?”

So lees ons in Romeine 10:14, en dis wat Johan en Marietjie Boshoff, geestelike werkers van Arbeidsbediening Mosselbaai doen waar hulle Plaasbediening 10 besoekpunte bedien. Dit vind plaas by sentrale punte waar plaasarbeiders van verskillende plase saamkom, of op individuele plase.

In die bedieningsarea van Vleesbaai is daar twee plase met ongeveer 14 werkers, by Kleinberg is daar een plaas met agt werkers, by Herberdsdale is daar vier plase met ongeveer 30 werkers, by Ruitersbos is daar een plaas met vyf werkers en by Brandwag is daar twee plase met ongeveer 18 werkers. Die Boshoffs bedien ook in Herberdsdale die Laerskoolkoshuis se kombuispersoneel.

Marietjie vertel: “In hierdie bediening kry ons te doen met baie onbereikte mense ten opsigte van die evangelie en het ook elkeen wat nog nie ’n Bybel gehad het nie van Bybels voorsien. Daar is sekere tye goeie meelewing en wanneer vrae gevra word, is daar goeie reaksie.

Gideons and Industrial Ministry – a formidable team in Swellendam!

Blackie Swart is the eager and inspired new spiritual worker for Industrial Ministry in Swellendam. He is also very involved with the Gideons and is thus able to serve as a valuable networker between various institutions.

In a recent interview he excitedly told the following, “We are 15 volunteers currently ministering to businesses at 18 ministry points. Many of these volunteers minister to the employees who work with them in these businesses. At some of the ministry points where employers are involved the employees are ministered to every day. At other ministry points employees are ministered to on a weekly or monthly basis. Today (18 May) we begin with our 19th ministry point!

“During this event we will also hand out 40 Pocket Bibles (containing the New Testament and Psalms) – 20 Afrikaans, 5 English and 15 Xhosa. The Gideons and Industrial Ministry have a very close relationship and complement each other in many supportive ways (such as with the provision of Pocket Bibles). Ministering also takes place amongst employees at recycling plants (which includes the dumping site).

“Some of our biggest challenges when it comes to ministering include accommodating people from different cultures and who speak different languages, seeing as people want to be ministered to in their own language. Should we attempt to accommodate everyone in this way, the number of services per ministry point will be too many, seeing as there will have to be one service per language. Many employers also prefer the ministering to be done before work starts and thus employees need to be at work earlier than usual, which is difficult for most of them to do.

“Patience is the answer because things don’t happen quickly. During this year the wonderful work Industrial Ministry does will be promoted and advertised at the Dutch Reformed Church in Swellendam. There businesses will be encouraged to allow their people to be ministered to. It will also be used as a platform to recruit more volunteers to come forward to assist us in catering to this big need.”
